SEGL Mission Statement

To provide intellectually motivated high school juniors who represent the diversity of the United States with the best possible opportunity to shape themselves into ethical leaders who will create positive change in our world.

Responsibilities:

- Work with the Ethics and Leadership team to design and implement the semester's curriculum
- Twelve to fifteen hours per week of classroom teaching plus substantial administrative preparation involving scheduling and coordination of guest speakers and field trips
- Online programming and/or additional teaching depending on interest and experience

Additional Responsibilities:

- Frequent overnight and weekend dormitory supervision (apartment included)
- Collaboration on curricular and extracurricular initiatives with students and faculty
- Additional administrative/residential responsibilities as determined during the hiring process
