Mathematics Teacher (Precalculus, Calculus)

The Mathematics teacher will teach a Precalculus class and two Calculus classes to prepare students for a successful return to their home school math programs and success on national standardized (SAT 1, ACT, AB/BC Calculus) tests. In addition, the faculty member will serve as an advisor and fulfill all regular duties and commitments required of SEGL faculty.

This position may include residential advisor duties and a rent-free apartment at our residences in Capitol Hill. This depends on the needs of the school and the qualifications and background of the person to be hired. Compensation will be adjusted accordingly.

About The School for Ethics and Global Leadership

Located in Washington, DC, The School for Ethics and Global Leadership (SEGL) is a semester-long residential program for a diverse group of intellectually motivated high school juniors from across the United States. The program selects students who have shown outstanding character, promise for leadership, and scholastic ability and provides them with a unique curriculum that emphasizes ethical thinking, leadership development, and international affairs.

SEGL Mission Statement

To provide intellectually motivated high school juniors who represent the diversity of the United States with the best possible opportunity to shape themselves into ethical leaders who create positive change in our world.

Responsibilities

- Develop and deliver curricula that are responsive to the needs of all of our students and the requirements of the mathematics programs of their home schools. In addition to two sections of Calculus (AP-aligned AB and BC sections), this includes a general precalculus class. Though most students will be studying some form of precalculus, the class must be aligned with the curricula of several home schools, and students will likely be studying a range of material, from intermediate algebra to introductory calculus.
- Twelve to fifteen hours per week of teaching - two sections of Precalculus, and one section each of Calculus AB and BC - plus substantial administrative preparation involving grading and other student feedback, and professional development.
- Frequent overnight and weekend dormitory supervision.
- Additional administrative/residential responsibilities as determined during the hiring process.

Qualifications

Applicants with a Bachelor's degree (or higher) in a relevant field (mathematics, physics, economics, etc.) are preferred. Teaching experience is required. Additionally, successful candidates will be:

- An independent, outside the box thinker
- Fearless, resilient, hard-working, organized, flexible and collaborative
- Excited to work as part of a passionate, collegial, mission-driven team that celebrates diversity.
